

Learning outcomes and course competences	<p>During this course the students receive an overall view of company law and corporate governance with a special regard to certain aspects of the topic. The importance of corporate governance is indisputable and its regulations and recommendations affect more people than it is thought. The course introduces corporate governance on the national and international level as well and the lectures lay a special emphasis on the corporate governance of state-owned enterprises. This aspect is not broadly examined in Hungary, however these companies and their lawful operation are crucially important for the national economy. The students will be able to utilize the gained knowledge in different contexts: they learn the bases of company law and become familiar with the recent tendencies of this field, studying about corporate governance helps them to understand the work and operation of companies, so they will be able to take advantage of the gained knowledge during their work in the public and private sector as well.</p>
